Bringing Back Your Tax Dollars

As a member of the powerful House Appropriations Committee, Rep. Lee was focused this quarter on advocacy for sound investments in key Nevada priorities. From drought solutions to education investments and programs to serve our veterans, the Appropriations Committee puts Rep. Lee in a strong position to defend Nevada priorities in the federal budget. In June, Rep. Lee joined her Appropriations colleagues for a series of 12 funding bill markups that reflected many of Rep. Lee's requests for southern Nevada investments. Now, these bills will be considered by the full House of Representatives.

These funding bills included over \$26.6 million in Community Project Funding that will directly invest in 15 southern Nevada projects, including:

- \$5 million to fund improvements to the Henderson I-515/I-11 Interchange
- \$1.33 million to expand Clark County's Social Service Mobile Health Outreach Program
- \$350,000 for the Clark County Small Business Opportunity Program
- \$1.7 million for LVMPD's CARE Team Diversion Program
- \$3 million to expand Southern Nevada Water Authority's Septic Conversion Program
- \$2.5 million for Desert Research Institute's Quantifying Carbon Fluxes initiative
- \$2.95 million for the City of Henderson's mental health co-responder crisis response unit
- \$400,000 for Boulder City Police Department's purchase of replacement vehicles
- \$611,968 to support NSC's School of Nursing launch of a career readiness program
- \$3 million for UNLV to expand capacity for advanced sports research and education
- \$1.34 million to establish NSC's School-Based Mental Health Clinic
- \$800,000 to expand Workforce Connections' ability to facilitate sector partnerships
- \$1.62 million to establish NSC's Center for Career Advancement and Education
- \$1 million to establish DRI's STEM and Educator-Student Partnerships Program
- \$1 million bring a 3T functional MRI scanner to UNLV and improve research capacity

These funding bills include additional support for Nevadans, including:

- Provisions to strengthen our supply chain and lower costs for Nevada families, including increased support for programs to help U.S. producers and funds to grow programs that fight hunger and nutrition insecurity
- Zero funding for the proposed nuclear waste repository at Yucca Mountain, as well as critical report language secured by Rep. Lee that will direct the Department of Energy to continue to pursue a consent-based approach for nuclear waste storage
- Significant investments in veterans' mental health, including funding for the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to take steps toward implementing the Zero Suicide program
- Investments in education directly in line with Rep. Lee's legislation, including support for sustainable Pell Grants, increased funding for Full-Service Community Schools, and an initial investment to advance a national matched savings grant program to help families save for college

Fighting for Lower Costs for Hardworking Nevadans

As Nevadans face rising costs at the gas pump and the grocery store, Rep. Lee has been pushing for legislation to bring down these costs and provide relief. As far back as December, Rep. Lee was calling on House leadership to hold votes on key legislation to address supply chain challenges that have contributed to inflation. In June, she once again joined her colleagues to urge Speaker Pelosi and Majority Leader to hold votes on a host of bills to combat rising costs.



"Hardworking families in our districts and across the country are facing rising costs across the board. While the reasons for these rising costs are many and varied, the fact remains that these inflationary pressures are harming our constituents, small businesses and working families. Rep. Lee's call to action worked, and the House passed legislation to address rising costs, including:

- The Lower Food and Fuel Costs Act, which takes three steps to lower costs for America's families:
 - Reduces fertilizer costs in the field to lower food prices in the grocery store
 - Lowers meat and poultry costs by increasing meatpacking competition and capacity
 - Lowers prices at the pump by making cheaper, cleaner Unleaded 88 (also known as E-15) more available.
- The Ocean Shipping Reform Act, which will help level the playing field by empowering the Federal Maritime Commission (FMC) to strengthen oversight of the shipping market and lower costs for consumers. This legislation will boost funding for the FMC and implement several key measures, including:
 - Combating exorbitant shipping costs by strengthening FMC enforcement action against exploitative business practices
 - Ensuring fairness in shipping by improving transparency and prohibiting ocean carriers from unreasonably refusing to transport American cargo

Key Legislative Developments

Nevada, like much of the country, is facing a dire doctor shortage. In fact, more than 83 million Americans live in areas that have been designated as Health Professional Shortage Areas. That's why Rep. Lee joined Reps Dave Joyce (R-OH), Tom O'Halleran (D-AZ), and Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA) to introduce the Improving Access to Health Care in Rural and Underserved Areas Act. This bipartisan legislation will increase access to primary care providers in rural and underserved areas through accredited continuing medical education and peer-to-peer clinical support.

Rep. Lee also introduced and passed legislation this quarter to invest in workforce development. The <u>Community-Based Workforce Development Act passed out of the House in May</u>, as part of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2022. As many employers are struggling to find qualified workers, while job seekers say that employers aren't meeting their training expectations, this legislation will help bridge the gap by bringing together workers, educators, and businesses to create training programs through state and local workforce systems.

As Nevadans have faced some of the highest gas prices in the nation, Rep. Lee is leading the fight to lower gas prices and hold Big Oil accountable. Big Oil companies made \$71 billion in profits last year and have over 9,000 untapped public leases. Rep. Lee urged House leadership to investigate and act on this corporate price gouging, and in return the House passed the **Consumer Fuel Price Gouging Prevention Act to lower gas prices** for consumers and hold Big Oil corporations accountable.

In response to a surge of deadly mass shootings across the nation, Rep. Lee took action on multiple gun violence prevention provisions this quarter. Rep. Lee voted to pass the **Protecting Our Kids Act** out of the House to raise the minimum age to purchase semiautomatic centerfire rifles, tackle gun trafficking, and build on ATF's regulatory ban on ghost guns. Rep. Lee also joined her House colleagues in passing the **Federal Extreme Risk Protection Order Act**, to build a federal program similar to Nevada's. In June, Rep. Lee cast her vote to pass the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act -- the first major federal gun safety law to pass Congress and be signed into law by the President in nearly 26 years.

Lake Mead continues to reach record lows, threatening our future water supply. Rep. Lee continues to fight for common-sense water solutions for Nevada. In the past quarter, Rep. Lee introduced the <u>Water Data Act</u> to create a national framework for water data and support collaboration and innovation across federal agencies, state and local entities, and water users, and Rep. Lee voted to pass the <u>Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) of 2022</u> which included an additional \$800 million in funding for the Section 595 program, which funds the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' critical work on water-related environmental infrastructure and resource protection projects.

Rep. Lee also <u>took action on rising housing prices</u>, introducing an amendment that passed as part of a Financial Services package. Rep. Lee's amendment would direct the Department of the Treasury and the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to combat the housing crisis in America by creating an interagency working group.

Additionally, Rep. Lee urged House leaders to take action on the <u>infant formula</u> <u>shortage</u>. In response, the House voted to pass two bills included a supplemental funding bill to provide the FDA with urgently needed resources and the Access to Baby Formula Act, which provides flexibility so that low-income families can continue purchasing safe infant formula with their WIC benefits during a crisis.

- A series of events with Secretary Xavier Becerra to discuss the President's <u>Cancer Moonshot initiative</u> and <u>local mental health services</u> in Nevada
- Welcoming Energy Secretary Jennifer Granholm back to Nevada to meet with NV Energy, members of IBEW, and homeowners benefiting from expanded weatherization assistance
- A visit from Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg to <u>break ground on</u> <u>upgrades to the I-15/Tropicana interchange</u>
- An Interfaith Roundtable with faith leaders from across southern Nevada, including
- Hosting a series of interviews with five Nevada veterans for the Library of Congress's <u>Veterans History Project in honor of Women Veterans Day</u> in June

Constituent Success Stories

Casework and constituent service has been a top priority for Rep. Lee ever since she became a Member of Congress. Over this past quarter, she's managed to...

- Recover approximately \$9,909,000 for constituents
- Deliver over \$10,900,000 in NV-03 Federal Grant Assistance
- Close over **351 cases** for constituents who requested assistance with a federal agency
- Respond to approximately **450 constituent requests** for assistance
- Respond to over 7,900 emails, calls, and letters from constituents about key issues and priorities
