A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a grant program to expand and improve the provision of telehealth services to veterans.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "VA Telehealth Expan-
- 5 sion Act".

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1SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAM TO EXPAND TELEHEALTH FROM2DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall enter into partnerships, and expand existing partner-4 5 ships, with entities that represent or serve veterans, nonprofit organizations, private businesses, and other inter-6 7 ested parties for the expansion of telehealth capabilities and the provision of telehealth services to veterans 8 9 through the award of grants under subsection (c). Such telehealth services shall be provided by health care pro-10 11 viders of the Department of Veterans Affairs or through 12 the Veterans Community Care Program under section 1703 of title 38, United States Code. 13

(b) PREFERENCE.—When selecting entities with
which to enter into or to expand a partnership under subsection (a), the Secretary shall give preference to entities
that—

(1) represent veterans in rural or highly rural
areas (as determined through the use of the RuralUrban Commuting Areas coding system of the Department of Agriculture); or

(2) operate in a medically underserved community (as defined in section 799B of the Public
Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 295p)).

25 (c) Award of Grants.—

1	(1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out partnerships
2	entered into or expanded under this section with en-
3	tities described in subsection (a), the Secretary shall
4	award grants to those entities.
5	(2) MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF GRANTS.—The
6	amount of a grant awarded under this subsection
7	may not exceed \$75,000 in one year.
8	(3) Use of grants.—
9	(A) IN GENERAL.—Grants awarded to an
10	entity under this subsection may be used for
11	one or more of the following:
12	(i) Purchasing or upgrading hardware
13	or software necessary for the provision of
14	secure and private telehealth services.
15	(ii) Upgrading security protocols for
16	consistency with the security requirements
17	of the Department.
18	(iii) Training of employees, including
19	payment of those employees for completing
20	that training, with respect to—
21	(I) military and veteran cultural
22	competence, if the entity is not an or-
23	ganization that represents veterans;

1	(II) appropriate processes for
2	handling emergencies that occur dur-
3	ing telehealth;
4	(III) equipment required to pro-
5	vide telehealth services; or
6	(IV) any other unique training
7	needs for the provision of telehealth
8	services to veterans.
9	(iv) Upgrading existing infrastructure
10	owned or leased by the entity to make
11	rooms more conducive to telehealth care,
12	including—
13	(I) additions or modifications to
14	windows or walls in an existing room,
15	or other alterations as needed to cre-
16	ate a new, private room;
17	(II) soundproofing of an existing
18	room;
19	(III) new electrical or internet
20	outlets in an existing room; or
21	(IV) aesthetic or other enhance-
22	ments to establish a more suitable
23	therapeutic environment.
24	(v) Upgrading existing infrastructure
25	to comply with the Americans with Disabil-

1	ities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et
2	seq.).
3	(vi) Upgrading infrastructure or inter-
4	net services.
5	(B) EXCLUSION.—Grants may not be used
6	for the purchase of new property or for major
7	construction projects, as determined by the Sec-
8	retary.
9	(d) Agreement on Telehealth Access
10	POINTS.—
11	(1) IN GENERAL.—An entity described in sub-
12	section (a) that seeks to establish a telehealth access
13	point for veterans but does not require grant fund-
14	ing under this section to do so may enter into an
15	agreement with the Department for the establish-
16	ment of such an access point.
17	(2) INSPECTION TO DETERMINE ADEQUACY OF
18	FACILITIES.—The Secretary shall inspect any such
19	access point to determine whether the access point
20	is private, secure, and accessible to veterans.
21	(e) Assessment of Barriers to Access.—
22	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 18 months
23	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
24	retary shall complete an assessment of barriers faced
25	by veterans in accessing telehealth services.

1	(2) ELEMENTS.—The assessment required by
2	paragraph (1) shall include the following:
3	(A) An assessment of current and potential
4	future barriers, including—
5	(i) cost;
6	(ii) access to broadband internet in-
7	frastructure and technology;
8	(iii) digital competency; and
9	(iv) discrimination (including cultural,
10	language, or medical discrimination).
11	(B) A description of how the Secretary
12	plans to address the barriers described in sub-
13	paragraph (A).
14	(C) Such other matters related access by
15	veterans to telehealth while not on property of
16	the Department the Secretary determines rel-
17	evant.
18	(3) REPORT.—Not later than 120 days after
19	the completion of the assessment required by para-
20	graph (1), the Secretary shall submit to the Com-
21	mittee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the
22	Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of
23	Representatives a report on the assessment, includ-
24	ing any recommendations for legislative or adminis-
25	trative action based on the results of the assessment.
